Our Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) covers the Nursery and Reception Years within our school. We aim to provide a warm, safe, caring, welcoming and stimulating environment where children develop lifelong learning skills and a passion for learning.

We accommodate children between the age two and five . We know that for many children this is their first experience away from the family and we endeavor to help them settle and develop their confidence as individuals. Our impressive Early Years space has two open plan classrooms, a focus classroom and a bespoke playground. This enables children to have their best start to their academic journey, which prepares them for their life at Hyland House School beyond the Early Years.







## Curriculum

Enabling our children to become independent learners is of great importance to us, therefore we provide a curriculum with a holistic approach so that our children learn as a whole and not in a fragmented way. We plan and provide opportunities and activities that will grab the interests of our children and set them up to make strong links in their learning.

In the Early Years the learning experience aims to inspire children inside and outside the classroom. Your child will learn new skills, explore the world around them and work with adults and other children. As well as learning through adult directed activities, children have the opportunity to plan and develop their own learning using the skills and knowledge they have acquired during this time

The curriculum meets the criteria outlined in the EYFS Framework. Our aim is to provide quality learning experiences for all our children; learning that is structured, balanced, relevant to the child and related to the real world. Everyday your child will have the opportunity to do the following:

### Our teaching approaches



As teaching staff we model behaviours and attitudes to learning all the time. We know that if our child learns how to learn they will become confident, resilient, thoughtful, independent learners, who problem solve and don't give up without trying their best!

We foster the attitude in our children that everyone can have a go. Children receive praise for their efforts and achievements and are celebrated in the moment. Through this powerful approach, our children learn to feel proud of themselves and the achievements of others.

We strive to create a rich and stimulating learning experience for all our children every day. We plan our weeks through topics and we always use high quality texts or language, rich role play to introduce this to our children as a way in for their learning to begin. We link all areas and activities as much as possible, so the children immerse themselves in new experiences. This enables them to develop their confidence as learners which feeds into all areas of their learning and

development. We teach the children lots of games, songs and rhymes which link directly to their learning.

We know children develop different skills and understanding at different paces and we plan for this. We support and encourage our children who need a little more time and challenge those with a deeper understanding.

Our learning environment is inspiring and the Bible is a springboard for learning in all subject learning. Our wall displays are creative, engaging and feature our children's voices or images of the children and their learning. We give importance to the incidental learning that we see happening, as this is where our children are truly using and applying knowledge, understanding and skills.
