- Reading Comprehension 100% achieved the standard with 20% exceeding.



As you begin to enjoy your holidays, I would like to encourage you to check your child's health records that they are up to date with their routine immunisation. If you discover that your child is missing any, please contact your GP. Recently there has been the detection of polio in sewage samples from London and the NHS is recommending booster vaccines to ensure that children are fully protected. There is a similar situation with MMR immunisation especially in London with many children under vaccinated and unprotected (children require 2 doses to be fully protected). Measles has been reported in Haringey recently so the health authorities would like you to take precautions.
