Important Reminders
ATTENDANCE

It is the department of Education that dictate attendance below 95% is poor and that below 90% is persistent absenteeism. Good attendance is vital for success of pupils and their wellbeing.

Our school data as well as the national data makes it clear that poor attendance results in poorer outcomes for children. Schools with a poor attendance and diminished outcomes do not remain "good".

Lack of punctuality can affect your child's attendance record as when a child comes in after 9:15 the registers are closed and your child is marked as late. When children are not punctual, they are at a disadvantage to their classmates who were on time. They often become anxious about their work and some may become withdrawn. However, the most devastating effect is the loss of valuable learning time which the children are unable to regain.

Please ensure that you get your children to us at Hyland House School by 8:55am. We aim to start promptly every day. Thank you for your continued support.
