Important Reminders ATTENDANCE/PUNCTUALITY

Who is responsible?

As a parent/carer you are responsible for making sure that your child attends the school at which he/she is registered regularly and punctually.

What happens if my child is unwell?

Children do become ill on occasions, but it's important that regular attendance is maintained as far as possible. Don't let minor or trivial ailments stop your child from attending school. The school will always contact you if your child is too unwell to complete the school day. If your child is absent, you must call the school on the first day. If no contact is made the school will contact you. If we are unable to contact you, we will carry out a home visit.

What will happen if my child does not attend school?

If your child fails to attend school regularly and the absences are unauthorised, as a parent/carer you are guilty of an offence under Section 444 of The Education Act 1996.
